Welcome to NOLS! We have designed this list to help you decide what to bring on your course. Please take time to read the following information carefully before making equipment choices.

Equipment selection and care is an essential wilderness skill, and there is a bewildering variety of equipment on today's market. We urge you to be careful about expensive pre-course purchases. Because you will have a better understanding of your equipment preferences after your NOLS course, we recommend renting from NOLS rather than purchasing expensive gear in advance. Gear rental will provide you with the opportunity to test specific items and will help you make more informed purchases. If you purchase major items, leave the tags on and keep the receipts in case you want to return them.

It can be confusing to know what is the best gear to use for your course before you experience the expedition. Varied personal desires make it difficult to suggest one perfect equipment list. Knowledge of the right equipment systems is a product of experience – we do not expect you to know exactly what to bring. For this reason, we have provided a complete list below with explanations of use, what to look for when buying an item, and some brand suggestions. When in doubt, please contact NOLS Yukon and we can give you more personal advice.

NOLS Yukon has a fully functional gear room complete with almost all the gear you will need for the course. This gear has been selected to meet the exact needs of your course. It may result in less confusion and reduce the risk of purchasing inappropriate gear to wait until you are at NOLS Yukon, and with your instructors' guidance, buy or rent the right gear. After your course you can buy the rental gear you liked, and/or will have the experience to go out and get the equipment that best suits your needs for future endeavors. As a non-profit, all our prices are competitive and the money you spend goes toward providing wilderness leadership opportunities for others.

Of course, you are welcome to bring gear you already own. Please try to match your selections as closely as possible to the items described in the following list. Your instructors will inspect all of the gear you bring to determine if it is suitable for your course's specific route and anticipated weather. If an item is not approved, you can leave it with your luggage. You may be asked to rent or purchase gear from our outfitting department to round out what you brought with you. Depending on the logistics specific to your course, you may be able to send in some clean clothing items during the switch from backpacking to canoeing. **Your instructor team and route will ultimately determine which gear is best for your expedition.**

If you wish to buy gear before your course, consider our preferred retailers. The staff at these stores is familiar with the equipment required for a NOLS course. Please ask the NOLS admission office about Preferred Retailers in your area or visit our web site at www.nols.edu.

To cover the cost of equipment rental, an **equipment deposit** has been charged to your account. (See your statement for the amount.) The deposit reflects the average amount students incur on the given course type. Your final equipment cost will vary according to how much gear you rent and/or purchase from NOLS, and if there are any charges for lost or damaged gear.

At the end of a course, students can purchase new and used equipment. NOLS offers substantial discounts for used equipment and the rental fee will be applied towards purchase. A cautionary note: additional gear purchases may raise the total outfitting bill well above the rental deposit amount. You will be billed for any charges that exceed your equipment deposit fee. Likewise, you will be refunded any unused balance. Your bill or refund will be mailed within 2-4 weeks of the end of your course. Please note that **rental and purchase prices are subject to change.**

Item Availability

Available at NOLS: Can be rented or purchased from NOLS Yukon, if you choose to not bring from home.

Must Bring: Not available from NOLS; bring from home.

Optional: Item is not needed, but may be desired.

Upper Body Layers

We layer our clothing, combining different garments to achieve optimum insulation and protection from wind, rain and snow. The upper garments listed here are either synthetic or wool, which insulate when wet, or nylon or Gore-Tex® which help prevent heat loss by cutting wind, rain and snow. You will need 3-4 insulating layers, plus a wind and a rain layer. All must fit comfortably over one another so they may be worn simultaneously. With the exception of your t-shirt, cotton and cotton blends are unacceptable, as cotton offers poor insulation when wet. During the river travel, it is useful to have one under layer, which will get wet, for the river and a second under layer, which will be dry, for camp.

Under Layer (Mid-Weight Synthetic)	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$35-40	2	Mid-weight underwear top made of wool, polypropylene, or Capilene®. Zip turtleneck styles are a good choice for comfort and the ability to vent.	
Secondary or Middle Layer (Fleece Pullover)	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$35-50	1-2	There are many options for middle layers. Some are inherently warmer than others. If you tend to get cold, choose a heavier layer or 2 middle layers. Expedition weight underwear, polyester fleece pullover of Polartec® 100 or 200, or a wool sweater are appropriate.	
Top Layer (Fleece or synthetic puff jacket)	Available at NOLS \$25	Available at NOLS \$85 - 160	1	Heavyweight, full-length zip fleece (Polartec® 300) or synthetic puff jacket (polyester). Must fit comfortably over your other insulating layers.	
Fleece Vest <u>(Optional)</u>	Available at NOLS \$10	Available at NOLS \$50-60	1	Optional. A polyester fleece vest of Polartec® 200 or a synthetic filled vest. This is an additional layer if you tend to get cold. It should not be substituted for any of your 3 insulating layers.	
Wind Shirt / Anorak <u>(Optional)</u>	Available at NOLS \$20	Available at NOLS \$60-120	1	Optional. A lightweight, breathable, durable nylon wind shell, pullover or parka style, that fits comfortably over all your insulating layers. We strongly recommend a hood. There are many styles out there – this item is meant to be worn while hiking, or in windy conditions, where a rain jacket would be too hot.	
Rain Parka	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$100-150	1	Sturdy, roomy waterproof jacket with a hood. Both coated nylon and breathable fabrics such as Gore-Tex® are acceptable. Consider the balance between a lightweight jacket, that seems durable, to withstand abrasion. “3-ply” fabric is suggested.	
Bug Shirt <u>(Optional)</u>	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$10-20	1	Optional. A bug shirt is a combination of cotton and mesh fabric that keeps your upper body, head and face protected from mosquitoes. Often our instructors’ most favored piece of clothing!

T-Shirt	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$29	2	A cotton or lightweight polyester/Capilene T-shirt. NOLS Yukon has cotton T- shirts for sale.	

Our advice? Bring the fleece jackets and mid-layers you think might work. We'll advise you on the best combination for your course, the season and area. We also have a wide selection at NOLS Yukon and can get you the right layers when you get here.

Lower Body Layers

You will need 2 synthetic insulating layers plus a wind layer. Most students are comfortable with a mid-weight primary (or base) layer and an expedition weight second layer. Both must fit comfortably over each other so that they can be worn at the same time. If you tend to get cold easily, bring a pair of fleece pants for your second layer.

Second Layer (Exp.-Weight Synthetic)	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$40	1 pair	Expedition weight bottoms that fit comfortably over the under layer.	
Fleece Pants (Optional)	Available at NOLS \$20	Available at NOLS \$40	1 pair	Optional. Choose to bring these or a pair above depending on how cold you get. Polartec® 200 or equivalent. Side zippers make it easier to put pants on over boots.	
Wind Pants	Available at NOLS \$30	Available at NOLS \$69	1 pair	Breathable nylon wind pants, roomy enough to fit over all lower body garments. Gore-Tex® pants are acceptable and can double as rain pants. Zippered legs will help you slip your pants on over boots. We recommend that you rent wind pants from us. NOLS has a custom design that includes zippered legs and reinforced patches at points of wear. They are frequently the one item students will purchase after their course.

We recommend that men go without underwear and use nylon athletic shorts with liners. We recommend women bring 3-4 pair of underwear and non-cotton sports bras.	
Our advice? Bring the synthetic or wool long johns or exercise pants you think might work. We'll advise you on the best combination for your course, the season and area. If you are unsure, wait to get the right layers at NOLS Yukon with the advice of your instructors.

Sun Hat	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$24	1	To protect ears and face from the sun. Baseball caps are available for sale.	
Wool or Fleece Hat (Toque)	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$10-30	1	Warm hat made of wool or fleece. If you are using a hat instead of a balaclava, we recommend you bring a fleece neck gaiter for extra insulation.	
Mosquito Headnet	Available at NOLS \$5	Available at NOLS \$10	1	Light, nylon headnet with a drawstring. A high quality weave is worth its weight in gold. You do NOT require BOTH a bug jacket and mosquito headnet. One or the other is fine.	
Wool or Fleece Gloves or Mittens	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$10-25	1 pair	Ragg wool or synthetic (fleece).	
Mitten Shells	Available at NOLS \$12	Rental Only	1 pair	These are nylon shells that fit over your mittens or gloves. These over-mitts will keep your warm gloves/mittens dry.	
Our advice? As long as they're not cotton, bring your gloves and mittens and we'll see if they'll work. You may need one pair, or depending on the weather, you may need two pairs. Also bring head layers that you like and we will help you pick the appropriate combination.

Backpack	Available at NOLS \$95	Available at NOLS \$200-400	1	Our packs are large, expedition models with a volume of 6300 to 7000 cubic inches (95-110 L). If you are planning to purchase a pack, it must meet this volume requirement to be suitable for a course. A 5000-6000 cubic inch pack may be acceptable with the addition of two large side pockets. Recommended packs include: NOLS/Lowe Alpine, Dana Designs Astraplane, Osprey Motherlode, Lowe Alpine Kanga Himal 100, Gregory Denali, North Face Aurora, Arc'Teryx Bora 95 and other packs of similar quality and capacity. If you do not already own a pack we recommend you rent one from us. If you bring your own, your instructors will examine it for suitability. If you own an external frame pack with a top extension bar and a minimum volume of 3500 cubic inches it may be suitable for your course. We do not recommend buying an external frame pack for your course. We have used internal frame packs for sale.	
Zip (Duffel) Bag <u>(Optional)</u>	Available at NOLS \$8	Rental Only	1	Optional. A lightweight medium-sized zippered nylon bag (approx. 12" x 24") with handles, is sometimes used as part of our packing system.	
Small Stuff Sacks <u>(Optional)</u>	Available at NOLS \$2	Rental Only	2-3	Optional. 2 or 3 small nylon or mesh sacks for organizing items in your pack.	

Our advice? An expedition backpack is a major purchase. If you don't already own one, we think you should use ours, gain some experience, then make an informed decision on your needs.

A bag with approximately 3 pounds of fill rated to 5° or 10° F and having 6-8 inches of loft is required. Much lighter down bags are for sale only, and can work well if cared for and stored in a waterproofed stuff sack.	
Compression Stuff Sack	Available at NOLS \$8	Available at NOLS \$20-30	1	Makes it easier to get your sleeping bag and other gear into an internal frame pack.

Our advice? A sleeping bag is another major purchase. If you don't already own one, we think you should use ours, gain some experience, then make an informed decision on your needs.

Adjustable Trekking Poles	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$60-100	1 pair	Optional, but recommended. Can reduce stress on your knees. Should be a sturdy 2-3 section telescoping model, as you will need to lash them to your pack in some situations.

Our advice? While some extra items are definitely worth their weight, bringing all the optional gear would really be too much. Think hard and make choices that are most likely to increase the positive outcomes of your expedition.

A thick pair for cushioning and a thin liner sock for reducing friction would also be an appropriate sock combination.	
Gaiters	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$25-75	1 pair	Must be knee high and durable. Outdoor Research, Black Diamond, Granite Gear, Rocky Mtn. High, Powder Line and Mountain Hardware all manufacture suitable gaiters.	
Camp Shoes	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$25-35	1 pair	Running, tennis, or cross-training athletic shoes, in good condition to wear in camp and on short excursions without your pack. We recommend you avoid expensive specialty shoes. Water resistant (closed toe) Holey Soles are available for purchase and are a functional and lightweight camp shoe option. NOTE: up to size 13 only

Galoshes/Waterproof shoes (Optional)	Available at NOLS \$8	Available at NOLS \$25-35	1 pair	Optional. Lightweight mid-calf length rubber galoshes that fit over your camp shoes. These may be required for some courses, depending on weather and route. Holey Soles makes very lightweight low cut boots – these are popular and available at NOLS.	
Our advice? Your boots will be a critical piece of gear. If they're not sturdy, don't provide enough support or don't fit properly with at least a liner and a wool sock, we won't let you use them. If you have any doubts about boots, please give us a call. Make sure to give yourself time to break your boots in before the start of your course. This will reduce blisters.					

Recommended Boots - (NOLS Yukon does not provide hiking boots.)

Medium-weight, off-trail backpacking/light mountaineering boots work best. This type of boot is constructed with a full grain leather upper and typically has a Vibram® rubber sole. Some models utilize an injection molded, composite rubber sole with a randed welt to bond the leather upper to the sole. Both types of sole are acceptable. These boots are designed for extended backpacking, provide good support for off-trail hiking with heavy packs, and usually require less break-in time than heavyweight mountaineering boots.

The following list is not exhaustive and is to be used for suggestions only. The boots listed here should help define what types are acceptable for your course. It is fine to substitute a similar boot for one listed here provided the model you bring is a good quality leather boot designed for extended backpacking expeditions with heavy packs.

If you have a CCG approved PFD, you may use it on your course with instructor approval. If you have any other PFD, you cannot use it during the time you are a NOLS student in Canada.	
Pogies/Neoprene Gloves (Optional)	Available at NOLS \$7	Available at NOLS \$20-25	1 pair	Optional. Nylon or neoprene overmitts that allow you to grip your canoe paddle. Neoprene gloves are also acceptable but not available at the branch.	
Rubber Boots (Optional)	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$35	1 pair	Optional. Calf-high boots with substantial non-slip sole to wear with fleece or wool socks around camp. We recommend fitting these with insulating insoles (such as Dr. Scholl's.) Not an option as river footwear.	
River Shoes	Must Bring	Must Bring	1 pair	A sturdy pair of close toe river shoes or neoprene booties, (e.g. Cholla). Must fit with a pair of neoprene socks, and must attach well enough to your feet that they will stay on while swimming. An old pair of sneakers is perfect NO Five Fingers Brand slippers.	
Neoprene Socks	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$12-18	1 pair	Lightweight neoprene socks without a hard sole.	
Swimsuit	Must Bring	Must Bring	1	A two- piece suit is especially convenient for women while wearing a wet suit.

Large Dry Bag (Bills Bag)	Available at NOLS \$35	Rental Only	1	A waterproof storage bag with harness that replaces your backpack while on the river. 110-litre capacity.	
Medium Dry Bag	Available at NOLS \$10	Available at NOLS \$20-30	1	A 20-litre waterproof storage bag for items you may need during the day while on the river (such as layers and snacks).	
Waterproof Camera Bag (Optional)	Purchase Only	Available at NOLS \$15-30	1	Optional. If you are bringing a camera, we recommend you bring a small dry bag to store your camera while paddling.	



Our advice? Comfortable rubber boots and river shoes are worth the investment. If you are bringing sandals or booties and you have an old pair of sneakers, we recommend you bring both so your instructors can set you up best for your specific river. If you own any of the remaining river gear, bring it with you. As with other items, we recommend you rent from us to experiment with the gear and with canoeing before making any big purchases.

Group Equipment

All items listed below are provided by NOLS and shared among all expedition members.
