### HYBRID WILDERNESS FIRST RESPONDER RECERTIFICATION (HWRR)

#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Hands-on, meet online. Enjoy our newly formatted WFR Recertification, which includes an online component in addition to the traditional scenarios and skills. Pre-work allows you to review the curriculum at your own pace, and focus on the hands-on element during your two days on course. You'll just need to complete all online components, including a written exam, prior to the course. Once on course, the scenario-based approach to recertification provides you the opportunity to test your skills against realistic situations. You'll practice and relearn wilderness medicine protocols, review evacuation and decision making guidelines, and receive the latest updates in wilderness medicine over the course of two days.

Students must successfully complete the online modules prior to arriving at the course. Students will then demonstrate their practical skills during scenarios throughout the in-person portion of the course. Students must successfully complete both components to pass the course and obtain recertification from NOLS Wilderness Medicine.

There are optional review resources (different from the online modules) found on the <u>Wilderness</u> <u>Medicine Resources</u> page.

Upon successful course completion you will earn the following NOLS Wilderness Medicine certifications: Wilderness Advanced First Aid/Wilderness First Responder/Wilderness EMT (dependent on your current certification), Adult and Child CPR & Airway Management, and Epinephrine Auto-injector.

## CLASS FORMAT AND PERSONAL PREPAREDNESS

This newly formatted WFR Recertification course includes an online module component. Upon registering, you will receive an email with further information. Three weeks prior to the start of the course you will receive an email with links to online materials (readings and videos) and the written WFR Recertification test.

You must complete all online components prior to arriving at the course site. Please note that these online resources are different from the review materials available on the NOLS Wilderness Medicine website.

Check-in is at 7:45 AM on the first day of the course. Course days run from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM, with an additional evening class on the first day for students needing CPR recertification. Attendance is required at all scheduled classes. Scenarios and practice sessions will take place both inside and outside.

Bring outdoor clothing appropriate for lying on the potentially wet, muddy, snowy, or cold ground playing the role of both rescuer and patient. Frequently stage (moulage) blood and make-up are used to enhance the realism of a scenario. The classroom environment generally lends itself to a pair of comfy shoes or slippers and a camp chair.

#### **REGISTRATION AND TUITION PAYMENT**

Enroll online with NOLS & complete the MOSS Waiver; Password: guest; Group Name: NOLS.

Tuition payment in full is required to reserve your spot in the course. You can pay your tuition online (NOLS accepts Visa or MasterCard), by calling the NOLS Wilderness Medicine office with credit card information, or by mailing a check to NOLS (with driver's license number).

The tuition fee includes instruction, textbooks, equipment use, certification, and continuing education credits.

A full refund will be given if the course is canceled.

# WAFA/WFR/WEMT RECERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

<u>NOLS Wilderness Medicine Graduates:</u> NOLS Wilderness Medicine certification holders will be afforded a one-year period after expiration within which to recertify. This one-year re-entry period is only offered to those certified through NOLS Wilderness Medicine. Enrolled students must bring their certification card to the course so that the instructor can verify the expiration date.

<u>Graduates from Other Wilderness Medicine</u> <u>Providers:</u> NOLS Wilderness Medicine welcomes eligible graduates from other providers to recertify on our Wilderness First Responder Recertification course or our Hybrid Wilderness First Responder Recertification course. To be eligible for recertification you must possess a current (unexpired) WAFA certification, WFR certification from a provider whose WFR course is a minimum of 70 hours, or WEMT certification.

There is no re-entry period once your certification expires. It is your responsibility to make sure your certification meets this standard. If you are unsure, please contact NOLS Wilderness Medicine to verify your certification qualifies before enrolling in a course.

Students certified by other wilderness medicine providers are required to submit a photocopy of their unexpired certification card on the first day of the course. We cannot issue you a new card until we have verified your previous training. Students recertifying the wilderness portion of their WEMT certification must submit a photocopy of their current EMT card on course.

#### NOLS WILDERNESS MEDICINE STUDENT AGREEMENT

Download the <u>NOLS Student Agreement</u> and read it carefully as it affects your legal rights.

Bring the two-page signed document to the first day of the course. If you are a minor, a parent or guardian must sign the document as well. Without a signed document, you cannot participate in the course. NOLS Wilderness Medicine participants, including minors, will have unsupervised free time throughout the course. Any activities during free time are not part of the NOLS Wilderness Medicine program and are at the sole risk of the participant.

#### CANCELATION

If you cancel or withdraw from a course:

- Greater than or equal to 30 days prior to the course start date, NOLS Wilderness Medicine will retain a \$35.00 administrative fee. The remainder of tuition collected to date will be refunded.
- Within 30 days of the course start date, tuition is non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Once the course begins, no refunds will be awarded. All course registrations are non-transferable.

#### CONTINUING EDUCATION

<u>EMT Continuing Education:</u> NOLS Wilderness Medicine is proud to be a Commission on Accreditation of Pre-Hospital Continuing Education (CAPCE) accredited organization. Current EMTs are eligible to receive 18 CEU hours for participation in a Wilderness First Responder course. Please bring a photocopy of your current EMT card(s) with you to your course.

#### **COLLEGE CREDITS**

<u>Pre-Course Access to College Credit:</u> The HWFR-R course is pre-approved for 1 credit through Western State Colorado University or an additional cost. Interested students must initiate registration and payment for credit by contacting Western at least 30 days prior to the course start. More information can be found <u>here</u>.

<u>On-Course Access to College Credit</u>: The HWFR-R course is pre-approved for one semester hour credit through the University of Utah for an additional cost. If you are interested in receiving college credit, please ask your instructors on the first day of class for the necessary information.

#### LODGING/MEALS

On site lodging begins Thursday afternoon, December 19 and ends Saturday afternoon, December 21. The lodging facilities are bunkhouse units; space may be shared with up to seven other people. Bring bedding, linens and toiletries with you; bottom sheets are provided.

On site meals begin with breakfast on Friday, December 20 and end with hot lunch on Saturday, December 21. Meals are 30 minutes long; be sure to arrive in the first 10 minutes to ensure someone doesn't get seconds before you get firsts! We serve one main entree with sides and a yogurt/fruit or salad bar. We are happy to accommodate allergies, vegetarians and special meal requests. Feel free to contact us with questions about your specific meal needs.

There are no onsite camping or RV options. Student pets are not allowed during this course. Please contact the McCall Field Campus and the NOLS Wilderness Medicine office if you intend to bring a service animal to the course.
