Meals and Lodging

All meals and lodging are provided at Camp Huntington because of the remote location. The first meal will be lunch on Jan. 12 and the last meal will be a pack lunch on Jan. 21. The Fuge Dining Hall provides all meals with an entrée, a salad or fruit bar, and dessert. The food good, hot and plentiful. The lodging is rustic, but warm & comfortable, dorm style with shared rooms. Men and women stay in different dorms. Cross-country skis and snowshoes are available for use on trails. The classroom is equipped with six (6) lap tops and iPads to keep in touch with the outside world and/or take notes. You are welcomed to bring your own electronics. The wood-fired sauna is a good place to unwind at the end of a long day.

Pets are not allowed at the course site. This includes leashing them outside. Any student bringing a pet to class will be asked to leave. No exceptions.

Alcohol, tobacco or marijuana products are prohibited.

Travel

The course takes place at Huntington Memorial Camp, a National Historic Site, maintained by SUNY Cortland as an Outdoor Education facility. It is located on a peninsula on the south bay of Raquette Lake in the Adirondack Park of upstate New York. Parking is available at Antlers on the west side of Raquette Lake. Students will walk or ski across a well-maintained ice road approximately one mile. Your gear will be transported by the College. Please refer to the information about camp, driving directions, maps, and facilities at www.Cortland.edu/outdoor.

The road conditions in January can be rather unpredictable, so please drive carefully and allow a margin of extra time. If following GPS or computer-generated directions, **DO NOT** take Uncas Road in Eagle Bay, as this is an unmaintained seasonal road. The street address for GPS is 540 Antlers Road, Raquette Lake, NY 13436. Syracuse and Albany are the two closest airports, both about 125 miles away. A van will be picking up and returning to Syracuse airport early morning (no later than 8 am) on Wednesday, Jan. 12 and late afternoon on the last day of the course. If interested in riding in the van, contact Rhonda Pitoniak.
