Travel, Meals, and Lodging

Meals and Lodging

There are no provided meals or lodging for this course. Students are required to arrange all lodging and food. There are ample hotels and restaurants available in Port Townsend, within 20 minutes of the venue, and many nearby campgrounds, including Oak Bay Campground, Fort Townsend Campground, Fort Worden State Park, and more. Chimacum and Port Hadlock have restaurants and grocery stores within minutes of the venue,

A kitchen space, including refrigerator/freezer, sinks, stove/oven, and microwave, is available for student use during class time.

Travel

The course takes place at the Chimacum Grange Hall, at 9572 Rhody Dr, Chimacum, WA.

From Port Townsend: follow WA-19 South for 10 miles. The Grange Hall will be on your left shortly after HJ Carroll Park, and across from the Tri-Area Community Center.

From Highway 101 Northbound (Shelton/Olympia): take Center Rd North from Quilcene, turn left on WA-19 / Rhody Dr, and the Grange Hall will be on your right in 0.5 mi.

From Hwy 101 Southbound (Port Angeles, Sequim, etc.): Take Hwy 20 from Discovery Bay for 3.7 miles, turn right on Anderson Lake Rd for 2.8 miles, then turn right on Rhody Dr. Wa-19; the Grange Hall will be on your left in 0.5 mi. Parking is free.

From Seattle / the Kitsap Peninsula: take Hwy 104 across the Hood Canal Bridge, then turn right after 5.5 miles onto WA-19 / Beaver Valley Rd. Follow Beaver Valley Rd north for 9.7 miles; the Grange Hall will be on your right across from the Tri-Area Community Center.
